
Scienceworks Excursion

On Monday the 19th of June Grades 5 and 6 went to Scienceworks at Spotswood near the City. It took an hour to get there, but the wait was worth it.

When we arrived we had our morning snack then we went to the Melbourne Planetarium. This is a gigantic dome shaped room where pictures are projected onto the roof. We sat in chairs that folded backwards so that we were facing the ceiling. A person then narrated a video about the solar system and we learnt how to distinguish some constellations from random stars. We were also shown how to locate Saturn and Jupiter, which was pretty cool.



We then visited the Lightning Room. This is a room where we got to conduct experiments with real bolts of lightning and static electricity. We also did some harmless experiments using static electricity. Hope in Grade 5 touched a metal ball which made her hair stick up. We also learnt about safe places to go when there is a lightning storm.



Some safe places to go are inside a car or plane, but DO NOT stand in the open with a golf club above your head, because some people might think you are crazy, and there is also a slight chance (ginormous chance) that you will be struck and killed.

The last thing we did was explore the Interactive Area. This is where there are a series of rooms that we could see the effects of some science experiments. You could also explore some sporting areas that we could test our abilities in.
